# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING

November 7, 2017

Following are the Minutes of the regular monthly Council Meeting for the City of St. Regis Park, held at 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, November 7, 2017, at 4318 Taylorsville Road, Louisville, Kentucky 40220.

# **ROLL CALL:**

Present: Mayor Brandt Davis; Council Members: Talbott Allen, Bob Graves, Eric Shackelford, Louie Schweickhardt, Frank Wheatley, Jeff Weis, and Cheryl Willett.

Absent: None.

Prior to the meeting, four (4) applicants were interviewed for the open Citation Officer position.

# **MAYOR'S REPORT:**

John McIntyre, CPA of McIntyre & Wooldridge, PSC presented the independent 2016-2017 financial audit report. Mr. Graves made a motion to approve the 2016-2017 audit report as presented. The motion was seconded by Ms. Willett. It passed without dissent. The required audit information will be published in the December 2017 newsletter.

# **FINANCIAL REPORT:**

Mr. Charles J, Veeneman, CPA, City Accountant, presented the Financial and Investment Report for October 2017. General Fund revenues for the month were \$48,295.12, with year-to-date revenues at \$317,932.06. Total expenses for the month were \$28,072.58, with year-to-date expenses at \$133,512.06, resulting in year-to-date revenues over expenses of \$184,420.00.

Road Fund revenues for the month were \$2,886.34, with year-to-date revenues at \$10,614.86. Total expenses were \$0, with year-to-date expenses at \$0, resulting in year-to-date excess revenues of \$10,614.86.

Year-to-date interest earned on investments was \$4,485.96.

Mr. Schweickhardt made a motion to approve the October 2017 Financial Report. The motion was seconded by Mr. Allen. It passed without dissent.

Mr. Wheatley made a motion to purchase a two (2) year \$100,000.00 certificate of deposit (CD) through Fifth Third Securities. The motion was seconded by Mr. Shackelford.

It passed without dissent.

# **MINUTES:**

Mr. Shackelford made a motion to approve the Minutes of the Regular Council Meeting held on October 4, 2017. The motion was seconded by Ms. Willett. It passed without dissent.

# **POLICE REPORT:**

Officer Doug Richardson of the Louisville Metro Police Department was in attendance representing Kentuckiana Law Enforcement (KLE). The KLE Small City Activity Report for the month of October 2017 will be published in the December newsletter.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT: MEL MILBURN (Absent) No Report.

CITATION OFFICER'S REPORT: STEPHEN HOARD (Absent) No Report.

# **CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT: JOHN SINGLER**

Mr. Singler presented information regarding the cable franchise fee process. Mr. Singler will present additional information at the December meeting regarding the City's right to impose franchise fees.

# **BUILDING PERMITS: LOUIE SCHWEICKHARDT**

Councilman Shackelford requested a variance to install a vinyl fence at his residence. After Council discussion, Mr. Schweickhardt made a motion to approve the variance. Ms. Willett seconded the motion. It passed without dissent. Mr. Shackelford abstained from voting on the motion.

The ordinance regarding fence construction will be reviewed at the December meeting.

A permit to install a fence on Woodward Way was issued.

# **SPECIAL EVENTS: TALBOTT ALLEN**

The annual holiday social is scheduled for Sunday, December 10, from 4:00-6:00 p.m. at St. Andrew United Church of Christ on Browns Lane.

# **PUBLIC SAFETY: CHERYL WILLETT**

Mr. Weis expressed concern that Kentuckiana Law Enforcement is not issuing traffic citations for moving violations, as directed by the Council. After Council discussion, Mayor Davis requested that Mr. Singler provide information on other police agencies that may wish to provide police services in the City.

The City has "No Parking" signs available for use by residents who host large gatherings.

# **PUBLIC WORKS: ERIC SHACKELFORD**

The new street signs that will replace faded or damaged signs will be installed by the end of November.

# **COMMUNICATIONS FACILITATOR: BOB GRAVES**

Walsh Brothers has been contracted to clear the vegetation along the sound barrier wall and the project should be completed by December 1.

# **FINANCE: JEFF WEIS**

Mr. Weis reviewed the bank statements for September 2017 and found no issues in the reconciliation process.

# TREE BOARD:

Ms. Cindi Sullivan, the contracted City Arborist, attended the meeting and reported that twenty (20) new trees will be planted in the City within the next 15 days.

A resident at 2606 Foxy Poise Road requested reimbursement for tree maintenance without following the requirements for reimbursement. After Council discussion, the request was denied.

# **OLD BUSINESS:**

Rumpke offers yard waste cans at a cost of \$3.50 per month. The City will review this option during the next sanitation bid process.

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

Mr. Schweickhardt made a motion to move to executive session. Mr. Allen seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent. Ms. Willett made a motion to exit executive session. The motion was seconded by Mr. Shackelford. The motion passed without dissent. No action was taken in executive session.

Mr. Wheatley made a motion to hire Jason Lewis as the City Citation Officer. Mr. Schweickhardt seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent. Mr. Lewis will begin his employment on December 1, 2017.

# **ADJOURN:**

There being no further business, Mr. Wheatley made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Mr. Weis, and it passed without dissent. The meeting adjourned at 8:37 p.m.

# Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities and each major fund of the City of St. Regis Park, Kentucky as of and for the year ended June 30, 2017, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the City's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

# Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

# Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risk of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

# **Opinions**

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities and each major fund of the City of St. Regis Park, Kentucky at June 30, 2017, and the respective changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

# Other Matters

# **Required Supplementary Information**

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's budgetary comparison information on page 18 be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Government Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Management has omitted the Management's Discussion and Analysis that accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America has required to be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such missing information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Government Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. Our opinion on the basic financial statements is not affected by this missing information.

# Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued our report dated November 1, 2017, on our consideration of the City of St. Regis Park, Kentucky's internal control over financial reporting and on our test of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the result of that testing and not to provide an opinion on the internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards in considering the City's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.
