MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING

March 29, 2018

Following are the Minutes of the monthly Council Meeting for the City of St. Regis Park, held at 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, March 29, 2018, at Oxmoor Country Club located at 9000 Limehouse Lane, Louisville, Kentucky 40220. This meeting took the place of the April meeting that was scheduled for April 3, 2018. Public notification and posting of the meeting change was completed.

ROLL CALL:

Present: Mayor Brandt Davis; Council Members: Louie Schweickhardt, Frank Wheatley, Jeff Weis, and Cheryl Willett.

Absent: Fric Shackelford

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Davis presented Mr. Talbott Allen's resignation letter, effective March 28, 2018. Mr. Weis made a motion to accept Mr. Allen's resignation. Mr. Schweickhardt seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

John Amback and Kacy Noltemeyer were selected to fill the open council positions at the March 6, 2018 meeting and they were sworn in by John Singler.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Due to the meeting being held prior to the end of the month, the March and April financial reports will be delivered at the May 1, 2018 meeting.

MINUTES:

Ms. Weis made a motion to approve the Minutes of the Regular Council Meeting held on March 6, 2018. The motion was seconded by Mr. Wheatley and it passed without dissent.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT: MEL MILBURN (Absent)

Mayor Davis requested that John Singler provide a list of qualified engineers that could provide engineering services for the city.

CITATION OFFICER'S REPORT: JASON LEWIS

Mr. Lewis will submit the monthly report after March 31, 2018.

CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT: JOHN SINGLER

Mr. Singler addressed Mr. Weis's questions regarding the enforcement actions that may be taken against companies that solicit in the city. It was noted that any solicitor should have an ID clearly visible and be in possession of a permit from both the City of Louisville and the City of St. Regis Park.
Mr. Singler will draft language for the nuisance ordinance that will address rain barrels in the city.

BUILDING PERMITS: LOUIE SCHWEICKHARDT

Mr. Schweickhardt presented the LG&E contract for the replacement of the street light fixtures/bulbs on Mount Vernon Road and Mayor Davis approved.

SPECIAL EVENTS:

The Easter Egg Hunt was relocated to St Andrews church due to inclement weather. In the future, the city will have multiple locations in place, prior to the day of the event. Ms. Willett recognized the McMahan Fire Department and St. Andrews church for helping make the event successful.

PUBLIC SAFETY: CHERYL WILLETT:

The council discussed several options related to the police services provided by Kentuckiana Law Enforcement (KLE). The options include replacing KLE, reducing or limiting hours of service and providing more visible presence. Mayor Davis will meet with the KLE representatives to discuss future plans.


