Dear Citizens:

It is that time of year when students return to school and the grass doesn't seem to grow as fast. Soon, we will all start enjoying fall sports, chili and cooler weather. As Ascension and Greathouse resume, I have asked for our contracted police to really focus on speeding that occurs in our city. They will be concentrating on writing tickets and not giving warnings. I would ask you to remind friends and family that live in and frequent the neighborhood to be mindful of their speed.

We had a very, very productive council meeting when we discussed speed humps and other ideas that could curtail speeding and increase the safety of our neighborhood. About 35-40 citizens showed up and everyone had a chance to speak. At the September council meeting we plan on creating a survey to make sure each of our citizens' voices are heard, especially citizens most affected by the speeding.

In addition to speeding, we have had a rash of break-ins, mainly involving cars. However, alarmingly, we did have a couple of home break-ins. I would ask all citizens to make sure that their car/garage/home doors are all locked and that they leave plenty of outside lights on at night. I would also encourage everyone to consider contacting a home security company to get quotes on a home security system. This is a best practice. The city is and will continue to make sure we are doing our part in making sure everyone is safe. However, we want to make sure each homeowner is discouraging would-be burglars as much as possible on their end. Security systems go a long way in doing just that.

While the city has accomplished a great deal, there is still much to do. Over the next couple of weeks, we plan on tackling many projects including some of the following: painting the yellow curbs, interviewing engineering firms to replace our previous city engineer, finalizing a plan for new city signage and interviewing potentially new contracted police groups.

Remember, the City of St. Regis Park is a great place to live. Together, we will make it even better!

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR YARD SALE DAY

IF YOU ARE PARTICIPATING

Try to set up in your driveway or yard close to the street to be more visible.
Please park your personal vehicle further up in your driveway so that you do not take space on the street in front of your house and thus help keep the area on the street in front of your home open for traffic and allow parking for buyers coming from outside the City. Any suspicious behavior should be reported immediately, so if possible, have a cell phone nearby.
People come early, so plan to set up as early as possible.
Extra police will patrol that day. For any problem, contact them immediately and try to ge the license plate number and a car description of an offender's vehicle.
Join with neighbors and hold a multi-house sale at one location for a larger sale.
IF YOU <u>ARE NOT</u> PARTICIPATING
Please park your vehicle(s) off the street, but close to the street to avoid your driveway being used as a turn around point.
Report any suspicious or unusual activity to the police patrolling the City during the yard sale.
If possible, keep your garage door closed during the hours of the yard sale so that it will not attract attention.
There will be NO PARKING on the sides of the streets where fire hydrants are located. "No

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Parking" signs will be posted on Thursday evening, September 6th. Police patrols will ticket

those vehicles who do not comply.

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
