I hope this finds all of you doing well. The first item to bring to your attention is our new city contract with Ring. com. Councilman Craig Theis has done a fabulous job overseeing this. The program officially started on August 15th and will run until September 29 or until the funding limit is reached. The link to get started was previously shared on Facebook, the city website and the city block watch email. However, if for some reason you didn't see it, please go to stregispark.net. Under the RECENT NEWS column, you will see the announcement of the Ring.com partnership dated August 8, 2019. After clicking on that article, you will see "How to Participate" about half way down. From there, simply go to the second bullet point that says residents must apply via an application and click on the link. For any questions or follow up, please feel free to email councilman Craig Theis at Craigtheis@gmail. com. Again, thank you Councilman Theis for all of your hard work with this!!!

Next, I wanted to let you know that some of our city roads will be repaved starting on September 16th and will completed no later than October 22nd. We made sure to plan around the annual City Wide yard sale that takes place on September 7th. In regards to the yard sale, we will be placing "No Parking" Signs out on Thursday, September 5th. Please make sure to obey the signs. Officers will be writing tickets and having cars towed accordingly. Also, not only during the garage sale, but at all times, there is to be no side-by-side parking within city limits. For example, if one person is parked on one side of the street, please do not park directly across from them on the other side of the street. That makes it very difficult for traffic flow, especially emergency vehicles.

Last but not least, the Tree Board has done a FANTASTIC JOB planting new trees and making sure everyone knows about our City-Wide Tree Maintenance Program. However, they are asking me to remind everyone that many of the new trees they have helped plant over the last couple of years are in need of pruning. #### **ADJOURN:**



## St. Regis Park, KY Announces 'Ring' Partnership and Subsidy Match Program for Local Residents

#### Initiative aims to reduce crime in neighborhoods through investment in affordable, easy-to-use, and effective smart home security

**St. Regis Park, KY – 08/15/2019 –** St. Regis Park today announced its partnership with <u>Ring</u> and details for their joint subsidy match program that will provide discounts for local residents who wish to purchase select home security devices. During the program period beginning August 15, St. Regis Park residents will have the opportunity to receive a \$100 discount code funded by the City and Ring. The approved \$5,000 from the City combined with \$5,000 provided by Ring will enable 100 residents to participate in the program on a first-come-first-served basis.

"We are thrilled to partner with Ring and be able to continue to contribute to the safety and wellbeing of our citizens," said Mayor Brandt Davis. "We are big fans of Ring and this program truly fits what we are passionate about - protecting our citizens and their homes and continuing to make St. Regis Park a great place to live."

#### About the St. Regis Park Subsidy Program

The subsidy program will incentivize the purchase of Ring Video Doorbells and security devices which connect to the user's smartphone or tablet via the free Ring app (iOS/Android). Residents are then notified when the motion sensor is activated or if someone rings their doorbell, or they can choose to view the camera's live video feed at any time. Optional video subscription services are available for purchase to residents who want to save their Ring videos to view or share them at a later time.

#### How to Participate

- The promotional period for the program begins August 15 and will run until September 29 or until the funding limit is reached.
- To receive a promotional discount code, residents must apply via an application posted on the City website available here.
- Ring will then provide discount codes to eligible residents via email once daily, Monday-Friday at 3:00pm PT
- Promotional codes can only be redeemed at checkout at <u>Ring.com</u>. Please note that addresses will be verified to ensure the location is within City limits.
- St. Regis Park residents will have the opportunity to purchase the following devices with a \$100 off of the retail price:

- Promotional codes are limited to one per household and cannot be re-used or applied towards previously purchased Ring products.
- Residents will need to pay an additional subscription fee if they would like to save device footage or sign-up for the alarm monitoring service.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS FOR YARD SALE DAY**

#### IF YOU ARE PARTICIPATING

-----Try to set up in your driveway or yard close to the street to be more visible.

-----Please park your personal vehicle further up in your driveway so that you do not take space on the street in front of your house and thus help keep the area on the street in front of your home open for traffic and allow parking for buyers coming from outside the City. Any suspicious behavior should be reported immediately, so if possible, have a cell phone nearby.

-----People come early, so plan to set up as early as possible.

-----Extra police will patrol that day. For any problem, contact them immediately and try to get the license plate number and a car description of an offender's vehicle.

-----Join with neighbors and hold a multi-house sale at one location for a larger sale.

#### IF YOU ARE NOT PARTICIPATING

-----Please park your vehicle(s) off the street, but close to the street to avoid your driveway being used as a turn around point.

-----Report any suspicious or unusual activity to the police patrolling the City during the yard sale.


-----If possible, keep your garage door closed during the hours of the yard sale so that it will not attract attention.

There will be *NO PARKING* on the sides of the streets where fire hydrants are located. "No Parking" signs will be posted on the previous Thursday evening. Police patrols will ticket those vehicles who do not comply.
