ROLL CALL:

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Vernon and Mr. Pierce of Rumpke Sanitation attended the meeting to discuss the recent service issues in the city. Rumpke has experienced turnover and will continue to coach their new employees on the city service contract requirements.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

The city accountant, Mr. Charles J. Veeneman, CPA, presented the Financial and Investment Reports for November 2019. Ms. Willett made a motion to approve the reports as presented. Mr. Shackelford seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

The city attorney, Mr. John Singler of Singler and Ritsert presented the 2nd Reading of Ordinance #4, 2019-2020, an ordinance amending the construction of driveways. Mr. Weis made a motion to approve the 2nd Reading of the ordinance. Mr. Amback seconded the motion and it passed without dissent. CITY OF ST. REGIS PARK, KENTUCKY ORDINANCE #4, SERIES 2019 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES RELATING TO CONSTRUCTION OF DRIVEWAYS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of St. Regis Park has determined that certain sections of its Code of Ordinances dealing with the construction of driveways need to be expanded and updated, because of the popularity of larger driveways,

AND WHEREAS, as a city which has zoning authority, St. Regis Park has the authority to adopt reasonable design standards to protect the property values of the city; along with preserving the safety of the public ways and sidewalks,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. REGIS PARK:

<u>Section 1.</u> That Ordinance Section 150.18(C); is hereby are repealed and replaced as follows:

- (C) All driveways or parking lots shall be asphalt, concrete, or other hard durable surface approved by the City (no gravel). Construction shall be completed at the time of building the first structure on the lot. Driveways shall be kept in good repair and free of significant deterioration. Any additions or enlargements to any driveway or parking area in the City shall require a permit from the City of St. Regis Park. Anyone proposing to add or enlarge their driveway or other parking area must submit plans showing the location of the enlargement or addition on the lot. In addition, the type of construction, driveway material type and total dimensions must be part of the application for a permit. The City will make its decision to either grant or deny the permit, based on the following factors:
 - (1) Whether the driveway or parking area is compliant with the applicable sections of the Land Development Code and is no wider than the allowed 20 feet in width:
 - (2) Whether the addition or extension serves as a legitimate vehicular access to a residence or a garage, or a parking area for a boat or recreational vehicle located ten feet behind the rear wall of the residence and in compliance with the City's parking ordinances;
 - (3) Whether the applicant has properly dealt with drainage for the project;
 - (4) Whether sidewalks are impacted by the addition or extension; and
 - (5) Turn-arounds, pull-offs, circular, oval, or other non-standard driveways in the front, side or street side yard are not allowed in any part of the City, other than those homes whose driveways exit onto the heavily traveled roadways of Browns Lane and Lowe Road. This prohibition does not apply to driveways or parking areas that were constructed prior to the effective date of this ordinance

This Ordinance shall be effective upon adoption and publication as Section 2. required by law.


