Following are the Minutes of the June 2020 City Council Meeting for the City of St. Regis Park, held at 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, June 2, 2020 via ZOOM video conferencing.

ROLL CALL:

Present: Brandt Davis, John Amback, Donald Fountain, Craig Theis, Eric Shackelford, Louie Schweickhardt, Jeff Weis and Cheryl Willett.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Davis requested that future meeting be held in-person. A meeting location will be secured and COVID 19 precautions will be implemented.No Report

FINANCIAL REPORT:

The May 2020 financial report was presented by the city accountant, Mr. Charles J. Veeneman, CPA. Ms. Willett made a motion to approve the report. Mr. Schweickhardt seconded the motion and it passed without dissent. Copies of the financials are posted on the city website.

MINUTES:

Mr. Shackelford made a motion to approve the May 2020 Minutes of the Regular Council Meeting. The motion was seconded by Ms. Willett and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Weis stated that the April 2020 bank reconciliation was complete and there were no issues noted.

CITY ATTORNEY:

2nd Reading – Ordinance 6, 2019-2020 – Adoption of the Supplement to the Code of Ordinances (Series 2020-S9). Ms. Willett made a motion to approve. Mr. Amback seconded the motion and it passed without dissent..

2nd Reading – Ordinance 7, 2019-2020 – Amended Budget for 2019-2020. Mr. Schweickhardt made a motion to approve. Ms. Willett seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

2nd Reading - Ordinance 1, 2020-2021 – Tax and Sanitation Rate for FY 20-21. Mr. Weis made a motion to approve. Mr. Schweickhardt seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

2nd Reading – Ordinance 2, 2020-2021 – Budget for FY 20-21. Ms. Willett made a motion to approve. Mr. Amback seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

OLD BUSINESS:

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Fountain made a motion to approve \$5,140.13 for the purchase and planting of 55 trees at Greathouse Elementary School located

on Browns Lane. Mr. Weis seconded the motion and it passed, with Ms. Willett and Mr. Theis abstaining and Mr. Amback voting against it.

Mr. Amback made a motion to assist longtime St. Regis Park printing vendor, PrintWorx, to navigate through the Covid-19 crisis by offering them a free 1/4 page ad in the city newsletter through December 31, 2020. Mr. Theis seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Theis made a motion to authorize the disposal of the old city computer, which was declared as surplus property with zero value. Mr. Amback seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Fountain made a motion to cancel the citywide yard sale in September of 2020 due to COVID19. Ms. Willett seconded the motion and it passed, with Mr. Amback abstaining.

Ms. Willett made a motion to approve McIntyre and Wooldridge for the 2019-2020 financial audit. Mr. Schweickhardt seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

Speed Humps – Petitions to install speed humps were submitted by the residents who reside in the 4300 blocks of Lincoln Road and Dannywood Road. Over 70% of the residents approved the installation, as outlined in the ordinance. The city engineer will draft plans for the installation of the speed humps and the required signage that must

accompany them. The final decision on whether the hump(s) will be installed and where, will be made by the City Council.

ADJOURN:

There being no further business, Mr. Shackelford made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Ms. Willett and it passed without dissent. The meeting adjourned at 8:16pm.

ORDINANCE ______, SERIES 2020

ORDINANCE ENACTING AND ADOPTING A SUPPLEMENT TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ST. REGIS PARK, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, Ohio has completed the 2020 supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City of St. Regis Park, which supplement contains all ordinances of a general nature enacted since the prior supplement to the Code of Ordinances of this municipality; and

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation has recommended the revision or addition of certain sections of the Code of Ordinances which are based on or make references to sections of the Kentucky Revised Statutes;

WHEREAS, it is the intent of Council to accept these updated sections in accordance with the changes of the law of the Commonwealth of Kentucky;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of St. Regis Park:

SECTION 1. That the 2020 S-9 supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City of St. Regis Park, Kentucky, as submitted by American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, and as attached hereto, be and the same is hereby adopted by reference as if set out in its entirety. This supplement contains local legislation current through Ordinance 4, Series 2019, passed 12/3/2019.

SECTION 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its date of passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

CITY OF ST. REGIS PARK ORDINANCE NO 1, SERIES 2020-2021 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSMENT OF AN AD VALOREM TAX AND A SANITATION TAX

WHEREAS, in order to provide revenue for general governmental purposes and operation, with manner of assessment and collection of said taxes; and

WHEREAS, to provide the assessment of all real property within the City corporate limits as of January 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the provisions for the levy and collection of these taxes shall apply for a period starting on July 1, 2020 and ending June 30th, 2021.

NOW THEREFORE, the council of the City of St. Regis Park does ordain as follows:

Section 1:

The assessment of said real property shall be the valuation as listed on the Jefferson County Property Valuation tax records as of January 1st, 2020 and is hereby adopted as the assessment for ad valorem tax purposes.

Section 2:

To levy an ad valorem tax of all real property and property of utility companies as allowed by law at the rate of \$.115 cents per one hundred dollars of the assessed value.

Section 3:

To levy a special sanitation tax assessment under KRS 82.095 on every residence within the City at the rate of \$189.22 per household.

Section 4:

Said taxes shall be due and payable to the "City of St. Regis Park" and mailed to the City of St. Regis Park, C/O River City Bank, 2501 Bardstown Road, Louisville, KY 40205, as follows: July 15 through September 30th the discounted amount (5% discount off face amount). Face amount to October 31th. November 1 and thereafter, face amount of total bill, plus fifteen percent (15%) penalty, plus an additional one percent (1%) interest charge compounded per month starting November 1, 2020. November 1, 2020 the tax bill becomes delinquent and collection of said taxes shall be made in the manner prescribed by law. Failure to pay the tax and penalty shall and will constitute a lien upon the property in question.

Section 5:

The revenue from said taxes, interest and penalties shall be used for the general operating expenses of the City and for the general purposes for the City in the discharge of its municipal functions as ordained, resolved or directed by the City Council of St. Regis Park. Any surplus from said taxes shall go to the general operation fund of the City.

Section 6:

This ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication.

Did You Know?

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

No watercraft or watercraft trailer, utility trailer, recreational vehicle, motor home, bus, tractor, trailer or camper shall be parked or stored in a front, side or street side yard or on the street; except that it may be parked or stored ten feet behind the rear wall of the residence on a hard surface of asphalt or concrete, or in a garage. No recreational vehicle shall be used for living, sleeping or housekeeping purposes when parked or stored on a residential lot or in any location not approved for the use.
