Several of you have asked about trick-or-treating in SRP this year. Some council members and citizens discourage trick-or-treating this year. However, we cannot stop people from trick or treating. So, if you do go out, please follow these steps to help protect yourselves and others and to make sure the experience is fun for everyone: Avoid direct contact with trick-or-treaters; give out treats outdoors, if possible; set up a station with individually bagged treats for kids to take; wash hands before handling treats; wear a mask. In regards to masks, a costume mask is not a substitute for a cloth mask. Do not wear a costume mask over a cloth mask. It can make breathing more difficult. Masks should not be worn by children under the age of 2 or anyone who has trouble breathing. Stay at least 6 feet away from others who do not live with you. Wash your hands. Bring hand sanitizer with you and use it after touching objects or other people. Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Parents, supervise young children using hand sanitizer. # CITY OF ST. REGIS PARK MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING

### October 6, 2020

Following are the Minutes of the October 2020 City Council Meeting for the City of St. Regis Park, held at 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, October 6, 2020 via ZOOM video conferencing.

Present: Mayor Brandt Davis

Council Members: John Amback, Donald Fountain, Craig Theis, Eric Shackelford, Louie Schweickhardt, Jeff Weis and Cheryl Willett.

Mr. Charles Venneman, CPA presented the August and September 2020 financial reports.

Mr. Shackelford made a motion to approve the August 2020 financials. Mr. Schweickhardt seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Weis made a motion to approve the September 2020 financials. Mr. Shackelford seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Shackelford made a motion to approve the September 2020 Minutes. Mr. Amback seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

Ms. Willett made a motion to approve the 2nd Reading of Ordinance 3, 2020-2021, an ordinance approving the 10-year cable franchise agreement with Charter Communications. Mr. Shackelford seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken and all seven (7) council members voted to approve the motion.

Mr. Thies made a motion to install two (2) speed cushions and two (2) signs in the 4300 block of Lincoln Road and the 4300 block of Dannywood Road in accordance with the plans and recommendations from the city engineer. The motion was seconded by Mr. Shackelford. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed.

Mr. Schweickhardt made a motion to approve the funding of up to \$15,000.00 to Lawrence and Associates to improve the drainage on Mt. Vernon Road near the creek. Mr. Weis seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Amback made a motion that the City of St. Regis Park does not endorse or sponsor any Halloween activities in 2020 due to COVID-19. Mr. Fountain seconded the motion and it passed without dissent. There being no further business, Mr. Schweickhardt made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded Regis Park is conducting its regular City Council meetings by Ms. Willet and it passed without dissent. The meeting adjourned at 7:54pm. # Did You Know?

# QUALIFICATIONS FOR OPERATION OF GOLF CARTS AND ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES ON CITY STREETS

(A) A golf cart or ATV operating on a city street shall be insured in compliance with KRS 304.39-080 by the owner or operator, and the proof of insurance shall be inside the vehicle at all times of operation on a city street.

(B) Any person operating a low speed vehicle on a city street shall be subject to the traffic regulations of KRS Chapter 189.

(C) A golf cart or ATV operated on a city street shall:

(1) Prior to seeking a city permit, be inspected by a certified inspector designated by the County Sheriff and certified through the Department of Vehicle Regulation to ensure that the vehicle complies with the requirements of KRS 189.286. The inspection fee under this section shall not exceed \$5 with an additional fee not to exceed \$10 per trip charged if it becomes necessary for the certified inspector to travel to the site of the golf cart rather than having the golf cart brought to the Sheriff's inspection area;

(2) Be issued a sticker or permit for the golf cart or ATV by the city. The fee for an initial permit or sticker for low speed vehicle from the city shall be \$25. A permit shall be valid until the first day of March of the following year. The fee for a renewal permit or sticker from the city shall be \$15; and

(3) Display the permit or sticker issued by the city on the front of the vehicle that identifies that the golf cart or ATV is allowed to be operated on city streets.

# PENALTY.

(A) Operating a golf cart in violation of any provision of this chapter is a civil offense and as such may be addressed by the City of St. Regis Park. Any peace officer or citation officer may issue a citation for the violation of any provision of this chapter. Any person violating a provision of this chapter shall receive a civil fine of \$100 to \$500. Any person who violates any provision of this chapter two or more times within a 12-month period shall receive a civil fine of \$500 to \$1,000. Any person who receives a citation for violation of this chapter may contest the citation by sending written request for a hearing to the City of St. Regis Park to the address listed on the citation within seven days of receipt of the citation.
