Did You Know?

92.03 PROPERTY MAINTENANCE STANDARDS

It is hereby declared to be a public nuisance for any property owner (or other person in control of the property) to keep or maintain property, premises, or rights-of-way adjacent to the premises, in such a manner which causes, or tends to cause, substantial diminution in value of other properties, or which renders such properties as dangerous, or detrimental, or adverse to the health, or welfare, or offensive to the senses of the residents of the city. This includes, but is not limited to, the following conditions, which are hereby declared a nuisance.

(E) Any premises which detrimentally impacts the surrounding neighborhood because of dilapidation, deterioration or decay or is unsafe for the purpose for which it is being used or is not secured or is improperly secured.

(M) Permits any condition to exist that causes a building or grounds not to be in good repair. Such as but not limited to:

(1) Every window, exterior door, basement, porch, roof, eaves, foundation, exterior wall, exterior stairs, shall be reasonably watertight, weathertight, bird, animal, and rodent proof; and shall be kept in sound condition and good repair.

(2) All exterior wood surfaces, other than decay resistant woods, shall be protected from the elements and decay by paint, which is not lead-based paint, or by other protective covering or treatment. Any peeling paint is a violation of this section.

(3) All gutters, shutters, down spouts, and any other parts of the exterior of the home shall be maintained in operable condition and be fit for their intended purpose.

Proposed Ordinance

First Reading Scheduled for the April 6th City Council Meeting

CITY OF ST. REGIS PARK ORDINANCE NO. ____ AN ORDINANCE REVISING CHAPTER 90 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO ANIMALS TO ESTABLISH A PERMIT FOR RESIDENTIAL CHICKEN COOPS

WHEREAS, the City of St. Regis Park has prohibited the ownership of chickens in the city;

WHEREAS, the City of St. Regis Park was petitioned by residents to allow outdoor residential chickens in coops; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to respond by allowing chickens with a permit and inspection process to regulate chicken coops in the city so that they are not a nuisance to the community;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. REGIS PARK, KENTUCKY:

SECTION 1: The City of St. Regis Park does hereby enact the following amendment to sections of Chapter 90.10 of its codified ordinances, as follows:

90.10 ANIMALS IN CITY LIMITS; PROHIBITIONS

It shall be unlawful to keep within the city limits any swine, sheep, goats, horses, ponies, <u>poultry</u> or fowl, chickens, or cattle. <u>Chickens may be kept if the resident obtains a permit from the City</u> and complies with the other requirements of Section 90.11.

SECTION 2:

The City of St. Regis Park does hereby add section 90.11 to chapter 90 to allow residential chicken coops and to establish the permitting standards and procedures for chicken coops to certain of its Codified Ordinance Sections. Specifically, Sections 90.11).

90.11 PERMIT REQUIRED FOR OUTDOOR RESIDENTIAL CHICKEN COOPS

Any resident of the city that wishes to establish an outdoor residential chicken coop must obtain a chicken coop permit from the city. The permit will be secured after an initial inspection of the coop and run for the chickens for compliance with this section. This permit must be renewed annually to ensure that the coop/run remain in compliance from year to year. The cost for a permit is \$50 for the initial permit and \$25 for the annual inspection. To be granted a permit the following conditions must be met:

- 1. No more than five (5) chickens are allowed and they must be non-crowing chickens which excludes Roosters;
- 2. <u>Chickens, coops and runs must be in the behind the rear wall of the principal structure on the lot, in the rear yard of the property;</u>
- 3. <u>Coops and runs must be fully enclosed and screened tightly enough to prevent chickens</u> <u>getting out and rodents accessing chicken feed.</u> Additionally chicken feed must be kept <u>up an out of the way from rodents;</u>
- 4. Coops must be smaller than 120 square feet;
- 5. <u>Coops and runs must be attractive in appearance and not be made in a manner that</u> <u>appears haphazard or dilapidated, inspector will have the discretion to reject or accept the</u> <u>structures;</u>
- 6. <u>Coops and runs must be cleaned frequently and not create odor that would disturb</u> neighboring properties or prevent them from enjoying their outdoor areas;
- 7. Coops and runs must not attract rodents or flies;
- 8. <u>Chickens cannot be allowed to escape the premises and must be contained in the rear</u> yard of the permit property;
- 9. To obtain a permit the resident must show that the property is their primary residence at which they live full time and they are therefore present on the property and able to be responsible for the maintenance and security of the coop and run;
- 10. <u>Any person who violates the provisions of this ordinance may have his/her chicken</u> permit immediately revoked at the discretion of the Mayor.

SECTION 3:

This ordinance shall take effect upon enactment and publication according to law.

Tree Planting Request

As a resident of St. Regis Park, I agree to give the City of St. Regis Park (and its agents) my permission to enter my premises for the purpose of planting trees and release them from liability for same and further agree that any and all future maintenance of any planted tree or trees is my responsibility. I agree to maintain my new tree(s) to the best of my ability using the guidelines provided by the city arborist.

I will ensure that my tree(s) receive a regular thorough soaking of the soil in the root zone, and that the soil is kept consistently moist (but not wet) until the tree is well established.

I will ensure that my tree(s) maintain a healthy 2-3 inch layer of mulch over the root zone and that the mulch is kept from touching the trunk.
