Dear Citizens,

I hope this letter finds everyone staying warm after the brutal weather we experienced Christmas week. It has been a long time since we have seen temperatures that low. With that in mind, we had a productive discussion with a few concerned residents at January's council meeting regarding snow removal. Many residents have found the city streets impassable during the snow events in recent years creating a potential time delay for emergency vehicles. It has been our policy in the past to salt the intersections only where snow and ice are present and plow only when the snow is deeper (3-4 inches or more). At next month's meeting we will discuss costs associated with salting/brining all streets and courts as well as plowing lower depth snow events moving forward. I think we all realize it is time for improvement.

The Welcome signs as you enter the neighborhood have faded over the years and need to be replaced. At the next few council meetings, we will discuss the design for the new signs. The council will vote on a final design which will include our Tree City USA designation emblem. I am excited about this project to upgrade our city's curb appeal.

During recent meetings we have discussed projects to use the remaining American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds we received from the federal government. It has been decided to use those funds to upgrade deteriorating curbs in various locations throughout the city. Our city engineer is working on specifications and will go out for public bid this spring.

Finally, I want to make sure everyone is aware that the monthly city council meeting time has been changed to the third Wednesday of the month at 7:00PM. Meeting later in the month will provide more timely financial information for review. Our next council meeting will be Wednesday February 15th at the Jeffersontown Fire Station at 4318 Taylorsville Rd. I look forward to seeing those of you who can attend.

50.01 PLACEMENT, COLLECTION AND REMOVAL

- (A) No garbage, grass or trash shall be placed at the curb side before 3:00 p.m., the day prior to pickup.
- (B) All garbage cans and items not collected shall be removed from the curb side by 7:00 p.m., the day of pickup.
- (C) During the fall of the year, leaves may be placed at the curb side the day prior to pickup after 3:00 p.m., as provided in division (A).
- (D) The placement of garbage, grass, leaves, or trash at the curb side shall be at least five feet from the property line.

Since the city celebrates Arbor Day in April, the tree board decided to present this challenge to our citizens: Nominate your own tree or a neighbor's that you think might be the biggest tree in the park! Since last year we absolutely loved our new format of taking a different Walk in the Park each Arbor Day, this year's walk will have as its goal, walking to the winning tree and naming the tree and its owners our Tree Hero for 2023.


