I hope this letter finds everyone enjoying the nice weather while we still have it. As we know, the dog days of summer are upon us. Schools have let out for the summer and pools are opening. For those of you who are not already members of our local Upper Highlands Swim Club, I would encourage you to check it out. My siblings and I had so many memories of that pool growing up. I spent countless hours there connecting with many friends I still have to this day. It is an asset to our neighborhood and will be moving forward as long we continue to support it.

The May council meeting was a productive one. The first reading of our budget, which starts in July, was reviewed. The few changes included an increase in our allowance for snow removal to include salting all the streets next year pending snow and ice events. We have also included the necessary funding for road paving, which we anticipate happening next spring for the roads with the most deterioration. With that in mind, we also discussed the current tax rate needed to cover our budget. The council voted to keep our tax rate the same for this year at .095 and sanitation will be \$335.45/household.

Due to recent concerns from several residents, changes have been made to our ordinance regarding driveways. The council approved the first reading of a revised ordinance which no longer allows "new" proposed driveways to be installed from the front face of the "main" house out to the street including wrap around driveways. If you are considering a driveway that falls outside of our ordinance parameters, you must obtain a variance from the city. Please make sure you contact the city if you are considering any type of project before you start. A letter of compliance is required for all projects. If the project does not meet city ordinances, you must have a variance from the city.

Finally, we will be putting out American flags in all yards for July 4th again this year. This is a unique decoration our city does each year. I have so many gracious volunteers who help put them out every year.

May 17, 2023

Following are the Minutes of the May 17, 2023 City Council Meeting for the City of St. Regis Park, held at 7:00 p.m. at the Jeffersontown Fire Station #2.

Ms. Willett made a motion to approve the April 2023 financials. The motion was seconded by Mr. Shackelford, and it passed without dissent.

Ms. Willett made a motion to approve the April 2023 meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Theis, and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Weis made a motion to approve the 1st reading of Ordinance 5, 2022-2023, an ordinance amending the 2022-2023 budget. The motion was seconded by Mr. Amback, and it passed without dissent.

Ms. Willett made a motion to approve the 1st reading of Ordinance 1, 2023-2024, an ordinance establishing a property tax rate of .095 and a sanitation fee of \$335.45/household. The motion was seconded by Mr. Theis, and it passed, with Mr. Weis abstaining.

Ms. Willett made a motion to approve the 1st reading of Ordinance 2, 2023-2024, an ordinance establishing the budget for FY23-24. The motion was seconded by Mr. Weis, and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Shackelford made a motion to approve a change order for additional curb replacement by LIBS Paving. The change order amount is \$92,687.50 and will be funded by ARPA funds as outlined in Municipal Order 6, Series 22. The motion was seconded by Mr. Amback, and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Amback made a motion to approve the 1st reading of Ordinance 5, 2022-2023, an ordinance amending the driveway construction ordinance. The motion was seconded by Ms. Willett, and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Shackelford made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Mr. Amback, and it passed without dissent. The meeting adjourned at 8:33 pm

Did You Know?

90.02 ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE

- (A) No person who is the owner of any animal shall permit it to run at large in any public road, highway, street, lane, or alley, or upon an enclosure without the consent of the owner of the yard, lot, or enclosure.
- (B) The owner of an animal who permits it to run at large in violation of this section is liable for all damage caused by the animal upon the premises of another.

90.03 NOISE DISTURBANCE

No person shall keep or harbor any dog within the city which, by frequent and habitual barking, howling, or yelping, creates unreasonably loud and disturbing noises of such a character, intensity, and duration as to disturb the peace, quiet, and good order of one or more of the inhabitants of two or more separate residences. Any person who shall allow any dog habitually to remain, be lodged, or fed within any dwelling, yard, or enclosure which he occupies or owns shall be considered as harboring the dog.

Did You Know?

90.06 REMOVING AND DISCARDING ANIMAL WASTES

- (A) It shall be unlawful for any owner or person in charge of a dog, cat or any other animal to permit the animal to be on public property, or any private property other than that of the owner or person in charge or control of the animal without the permission of the owner of the property, or on any streets, sidewalks or rights-of-way in the city, without the owner or person in charge of the animals to have in his or her possession, a suitable device for the picking up, collection and proper sanitary disposal of the animal feces or manure.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for the owner or person in charge of a dog, cat or any other animal to permit or allow the animal to excrete manure or feces on public property, or on any private property other than that of the owner or person in charge or control of the animal without the permission of the owner of the property, or on any streets, sidewalks or rights-of-way in the city, unless the owner or person in control of the animal immediately removes all feces deposited by the animal and disposes of same in a sanitary manner.


