Did You Know?

50.01 PLACEMENT - COLLECTION AND REMOVAL

(A) No garbage, grass or trash shall be placed at the curb side before 3:00 p.m., the day prior to pick up.

(B) All garbage cans and items not collected shall be removed from the curb side by 7:00 p.m., the day of pickup.

(C) During the fall of the year, leaves may be placed at the curbside the day prior to pick up after 3:00 p.m., as provided in division (A).

(D) The placement of garbage, grass, leaves or trash at the curbside shall be near the curb within the property line and not on the street.

Trash Pick-up Day

St. Regis Park's normal collection day is Tuesday. When a holiday such as New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, or Christmas Day falls on Monday or Tuesday, then collection will be on Wednesday of that week.

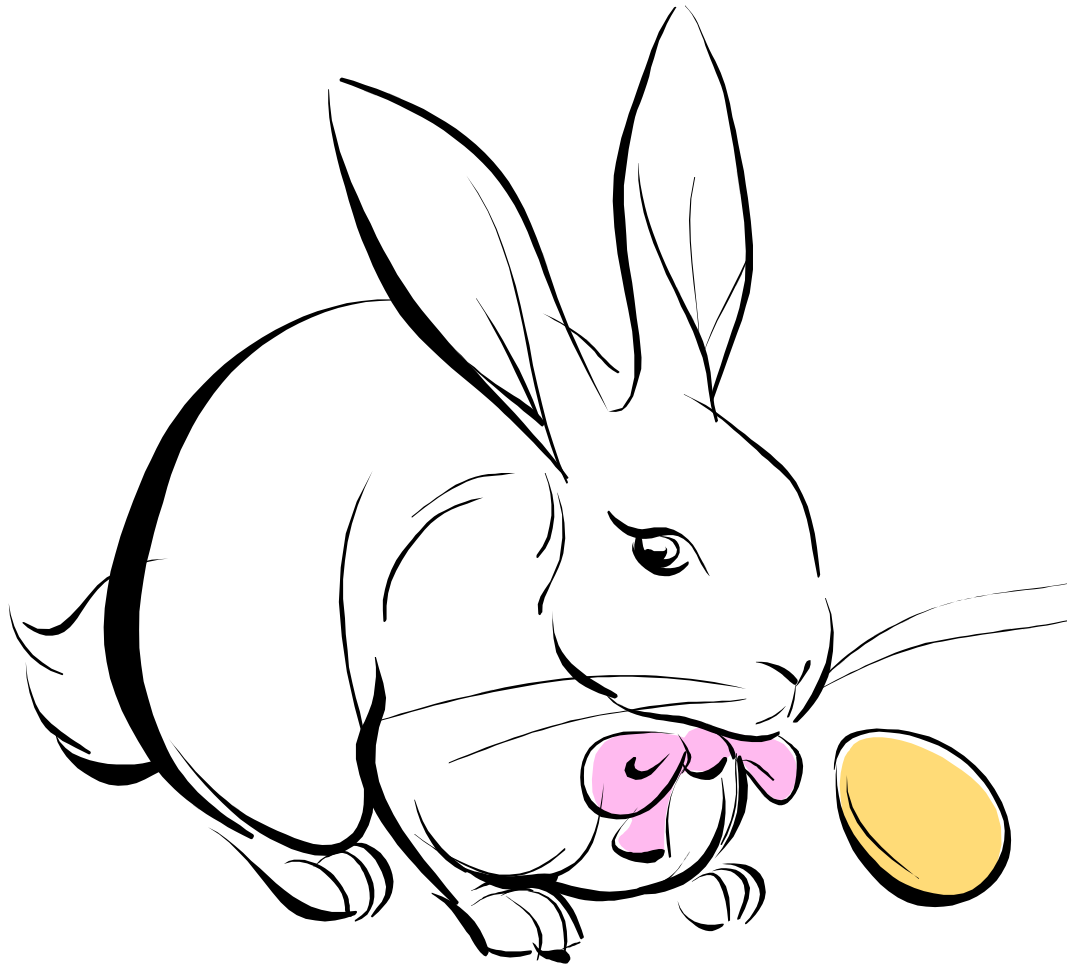
How to dispose of used or opened latex paint

CITY OF ST. REGIS PARK FINANCIAL AUDIT

The City of St. Regis Park hereby gives public notice that the annual financial audit for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, is complete. In compliance with KRS 91A.040(6), the City of St. Regis Park has published the Independent Auditor's Report and the budgetary comparison schedules for the City's major funds. A copy of the complete audit report, including financial statements and supplemental information, is on file at the City of St. Regis Park City Hall, 4318 Taylorsville Road, Louisville, Kentucky, and is available for public inspection during normal business hours. Any citizen may obtain from City Hall a copy of the complete audit, including financial statements and supplemental information, for personal use. Copies of the financial statement prepared in accordance with KRS 424.220 are available to the public at no charge by contacting Bill Hodapp at 502-654-8145.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinions. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS and *Government Auditing Standards* will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS and *Government Auditing Standards*, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the City of St. Regis Park, Kentucky's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the City of St. Regis Park, Kentucky's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Required Supplementary Information

Management has omitted Management's Discussion and Analysis that accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require to be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such missing information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. Our opinion on the basic financial statements is not affected by this missing information.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's budgetary comparison information on pages 24-26 be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Other Reporting Required by *Government Auditing Standards*

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued our report dated February 9, 2026 on our consideration of the City of St. Regis Park, Kentucky's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the City of St. Regis Park, Kentucky's internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering City of St. Regis Park, Kentucky's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

Arbor Day Proclamation

Eleventh Annual

Whereas The City of St. Regis Park , Kentucky, values trees as an important natural resource;

Whereas The city values the biological diversity of trees, and their role in providing air, water, and soil protection, filtering pollutants, and providing habitat;

Whereas The city values well-selected and maintained trees to contribute to property values and decreased energy costs;

Whereas The city's vision is a city with an appropriately full and healthy tree canopy;

Whereas The Tree Board and its city arborist support the mayor and city council in providing information, education, and incentives for maintaining existing trees, developing a healthy tree canopy, and planting new trees.

Whereas Arbor Day is celebrated throughout the United States and throughout the world;

Whereas The City of St. Regis Park has been recognized as a **Tree City USA** by the **Arbor Day Foundation**;

NOW THEREFORE, I Lois Schwackhardt **Mayor of the City of St. Regis Park, do hereby proclaim that for 2026, the 3rd Saturday of April, April 18th, 2026, will be celebrated as Arbor Day in our city.**

And I urge all citizens to plant and care for trees to promote the well-being of future generations.

U.S. flag etiquette

Proper display and care of the American flag honors the nation and the men and women who sacrificed to preserve it.

How to display the flag outdoors

- The flag should be displayed with the field of stars at the top of the flag staff or pole.
- Never display another flag (state, organization or corporate) above or to the right of the American flag.
- When displayed with the flags of other nations, never display the U.S. flag at a lower height than the other flags.
- When displaying the flag above a street, the field of stars should be at the top of the flag and face north or east.

Do not do this to a flag

- The flag should never be used as an advertisement or as clothing, bedding or draperies.
- Never hang the flag upside down, except as a distress signal.
- Don't display tattered, faded or worn flags. They should be destroyed with dignity.

How to display the flag indoors

- The flag should be displayed in a place of honor, to the right side of the stage. Other flags should be on the left side of the stage.
- When displayed flat against a wall, the field of stars should be in the upper left corner of the flag, whether the flag is displayed vertically or horizontally.
- The American flag should be displayed in the center and at the highest point when grouped with state or organization flags.

Caring for the flag

- Take the flag in at dusk or during inclement weather.
- The flag should never be thrown into the trash, but burned in a proper ceremony. Contact the American Legion or Boy Scouts.
- Clean and mend the flag, as needed.
