Did You Know?

92.03 PROPERTY MAINTENANCE STANDARDS

Yard Rubbish, Yard Waste, Junk, Inoperable Motor Vehicles

It is hereby declared to be a public nuisance for any property owner (or other person in control of the property) to keep or maintain property, premises, or rights-of-way adjacent to the premises, in such a manner which causes, or tends to cause, substantial diminution in value of other properties, or which renders such properties as dangerous, or detrimental, or adverse to the health, or welfare, or offensive to the senses of the residents of the city. This includes, but is not limited to, the following conditions, which are hereby declared a nuisance.

(H) Permits the accumulation of ashes, leaves, wood, lumber, limbs, twigs, storm debris and/or any residue from the burning of any combustible material.

(I) Any tree, stack, or other object standing in such a condition that is likely to, if the condition is allowed to continue, endanger life, limb or property, or cause hurt, damage or injury to persons or property by falling thereof or of parts thereof.

(J) Permits the dropping, deposit, or acquiesce in the dropping, depositing, scattering of waste material in any manner, in or on any public or private property any material of any kind, not including normal yard maintenance material.

(K) Junk; scrap metal, motor vehicles. The storage (unless enclosed within a garage) of motor vehicles in an inoperative condition, motor vehicles unfit for further use, automobile parts, scrap metal or junk.

BRANCHING OUT

Arbor Day 2026 was absolutely fabulous this year! Not because the weather was great-it rained-but because we had so much fun honoring Gerri Byron and her beautiful maple trees, and despite the rain, we had such a great crowd. The past few years we have been able to predict who would show up to walk—we see you, the Millers!—but this year the good folks of Statton and Milburn joined us to walk with the new mayor Laura Lewis, councilman John Amback, the tree board members, and the regulars! We oohed and aahed over the giant trees that still populate the oldest section of “The Park.”

So recently we have hit some milestones—11 years as a Tree City USA, over 500 trees planted, Arbor Day Walks in the Park through most sections of the city, so what can we do to top this? Here are a few suggestions:

- Sign up for a new tree this Fall. As you do your Spring plantings and cleanup, ponder whether your lawn needs a new tree. Is the paint fading on your front door because of your western exposure to the afternoon sun? Are your A/C bills out of control? Do your kids play video games all summer because your backyard is too hot for summer play? Does your yard just look empty, boring, or unwelcoming? We have a solution for you, and it costs you nothing, while adding to the value of your home—sign up for a Frank Otte-planted tree by August 31st, and in November, you’ll be on your way to ensuring that St. Regis Park lives up to its park-like atmosphere. Because what makes a park? It’s trees, of course!
- Take care of your existing trees. As we walked through Statton and Milburn on Arbor Day, it was easy to see what makes a neighborhood desirable. A major factor is the presence of mature trees. You can’t grow them overnight, but you can protect your existing stand of trees with regular trimming and health checks. And remember—we help you do it. After getting prices from two tree services that are bonded, insured, and have an arborist on staff, if you get one of them to do your necessary tree work, we will reimburse you 40%, up to \$500 per fiscal year.
- We are awfully dry for April, so be sure to water trees that are two-three years old or less. Fill up your water bags, or use your hose, but keep those young roots moist. A reminder that if you have bags you are finished with, you can drop them off on the front porch of 4512 Lincoln.

So let’s start our Spring right by resolving to put trees at the top of our outdoor priorities list!

Thank you in advance for helping your tree board to Re-Tree the Park!

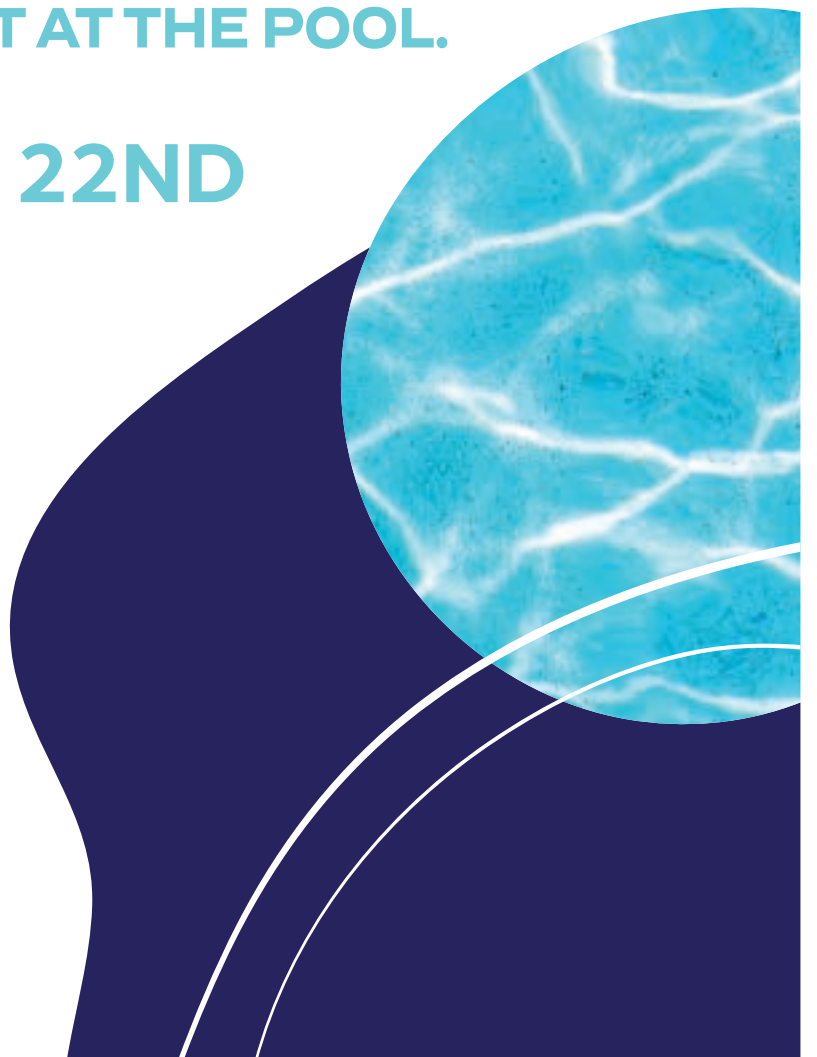

What Thieves Are Looking For

Auto Theft Prevention TIPS



● ELECTRONICS

GPS, MP3 Players,
Cameras, Computers,

MARK YOUR VALUABLES

Identifying your valuables by using a number like your driver's license number is always a good idea. Many cities even have a database where you can log the items and the unique number that you have engraved on the item. Items that may already have serial numbers you should keep a log of these in a safe place at home.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE A VICTIM

If you are a victim of an auto theft first action should always be to call 911 or local police. You can take pictures of how the vehicle was left by the thief, but do not touch anything in case there are fingerprints. Try to see if you can establish what was stolen by viewing through windows and estimate a total cost of stolen items.

REPORT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

If you see any suspicious activity in a parking lot dial 911 immediately. Most thieves will scout an area out and park closely if possible. They will constantly look around before attempting to break into a vehicle. They will often pull on many door handles to find one unlocked. Always call the police and never approach a suspicious person.

HIDE LOCK TAKE

Start today! Remind yourself and others when you leave the car to Hide Lock Take. If you see a person displaying items in their car or leave without locking it, remind them too. You can keep your car safe by reminding everyone else, so that criminals won't be successful in your area. Hide your belongings, Lock your car, and Take your keys!

PRECAUTIONS

Park your car in well lit areas and lots that have security. Don't leave your windows rolled down or cracked as this only makes it easier to break in to. Try to park nearest to street or entrances so that it is viewable to passerby's. Do not display decals or signs that upgrades have been made to your car. If your just not sure always go with the safest most protected choice.

Are you planning a Construction Project on your home in St. Regis Park?

The City of St. Regis Park requires homeowners apply for a Letter of Compliance from the City to ensure that their planned project complies with Ordinance Chapter 150, Building Regulations before they start. The following exterior projects require an application to St. Regis Park:

- Fences
- Porches
- Utility Sheds
- Playhouses
- Carports
- Driveway,
- Auxiliary Structures
- Garages
- Outdoor Temporary Storage Units (PODS)
- Pools (over 400 gallons)
- Building Additions
- Houses



Please Contact St. Regis Councilmember, Matt Sanderfer, to help you obtain the necessary Letter of Compliance from the City of St. Regis Park BEFORE you start on an exterior renovation. He can be reached at mattsanderfer@stregispark.net and can guide you through the process.

Don't Forget

In addition, homeowners must obtain all building, electrical, plumbing, and any other permits from Metro Louisville for construction projects as required by Louisville/Jefferson County. St. Regis Park will check Louisville Metro Building permits to ensure that buildings, electric and plumbing are up to code and inspected. Many projects require an approval both from the City of St. Regis Park and Louisville Metro.
