Welcome to August!

Summer is winding down, so please plan accordingly for increased traffic as schools return to session.

We recently experienced an increase in vehicle break-ins both within our community and across the city. If you observe suspicious activity or someone actively attempting to enter vehicles or your property, please call 911 rather than interacting with a potential criminal. For your safety, allow law enforcement to respond.

As a reminder:

- Keep vehicles locked.
- Remove valuables from sight.
- File a police report if your vehicle is targeted.
- Remember that Amazon and other delivery services may leave packages on porches during early morning hours, so not all activity during those times is suspicious.

Community Update:

The City approved installing a speed hump on the **4300 block of St. Regis Lane**, it will be included in the upcoming paving project. The request was initiated by a homeowner on that block and received strong neighborhood support, with **80% of residents on that block signing a petition in favor of a speed hump.**

Following are the Minutes for the July 2026 City Council Meeting held at the Jeffersontown Fire Station #2.

Mr. Theis made a motion to approve Ms. Willett as Mayor pro-tem. The motion was seconded by Mr. Weis, and it passed without dissent. Mayor Lewis arrived at 7:16pm and presided over the remainder of the meeting.

Mr. Neichter made a motion to approve the June 2026 financial report. The motion was seconded by Mr. Buckminster, and it passed without dissent.

Ms. Willett made a motion to approve the June 2026 meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Theis, and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Theis made a motion to approve the installation of speed humps in the 4300 block of St. Regis Lane. Ms. Willett seconded the motion, and it passed without dissent. 80% of the residents within that block were in favor, via signed petitions.

Mr. Hodapp disclosed that he may work for a contractor that provides services for the city.

Mr. Theis made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Mr. Neichter, and it passed without dissent. The meeting adjourned at 7:40pm.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR YARD SALE DAY

IF YOU ARE PARTICIPATING

-----Try to set up in your driveway or yard close to the street to be more visible.

-----Please park your personal vehicle further up in your driveway so that you do not take space on the street in front of your house and thus help keep the area on the street in front of your home open for traffic and allow parking for buyers coming from outside the City. Any suspicious behavior should be reported immediately.

-----People come early, so plan to set up as early as possible.

-----Extra police will patrol that day. For any problem, contact them immediately and try to get the license plate number and a car description of an offender's vehicle.

-----Join with neighbors and hold a multi-house sale at one location for a larger sale.

IF YOU ARE NOT PARTICIPATING

-----Please park your vehicle(s) off the street, but close to the street to avoid your driveway being used as a turn around point.

-----Report any suspicious or unusual activity to the police patrolling the City during the yard sale.

-----If possible, keep your garage door closed during the hours of the yard sale so that it will not attract attention.

There will be *NO PARKING* on the sides of the streets where fire hydrants are located. "No Parking" signs will be posted on the previous Thursday evening. Police patrols will ticket those vehicles who do not comply.

How to Get Your Tree This Fall (2026)

- First, take a look at the tree choices available for this year on the **SRP Tree Planting Request** Form in this newsletter. Names and pictures of this year's selections can be found there. You will note there are far fewer choices than in the past, and for now, we are offering only canopy trees.
- Fill out the Tree Request Form (2026) and return to Susan Messerschmidt by email at smesserschmidt4313@gmail.com or mailing address 4313 Dannywood Rd. Louisville, KY 40220 no later than **Aug. 30, 2026**.
- You should get confirmation from Susan a few days later via the email you provided that she has received your request and added you to the list.
- As planting time in November approaches, a member of the Tree Board will leave a white flag(s) in your yard. This is to be used to show the placement of the new tree(s). As you select your location, please keep in mind the mature size of the tree you have requested so that it isn't too close to buildings, other plantings or overhead power lines.
- The next step is for BUD (Before You DIG), now known as Kentucky 811, to visit your property to make sure no utility lines will be disturbed by the digging. **THE TREE BOARD WILL CONTACT KENTUCKY 811 FOR YOU!** They will visit SRP approximately two weeks before the planting is to take place in late November. If their markings indicate your chosen spot for your new tree will interfere with underground utilities, you will need to move the flag to indicate another location for your new tree.
- The final step is the actual planting! Currently we have only one planting per year which is in the fall. Our goal is to have the trees planted by November 30. If there is to be a delay, I will notify you via the email you provided.
- That's it! Enjoy your new tree!

Tree Planting Request

As a resident of St. Regis Park, I agree to give the City of St. Regis Park (and its agents) my permission to enter my premises for the purpose of planting trees and to release them from liability for same and further agree that any and all future maintenance of any planted tree or trees is my responsibility. I agree to maintain my new tree(s) to the best of my ability using the guidelines provided by the St Regis Park Tree Board.

I will ensure that my tree(s) receive a regular thorough soaking of the soil in the root zone, and that the soil is kept consistently moist (but not wet) until the tree is well established. I will ensure that my tree(s) maintain a healthy 2-3 inch layer of mulch over the root zone and that the mulch is kept from touching the trunk.

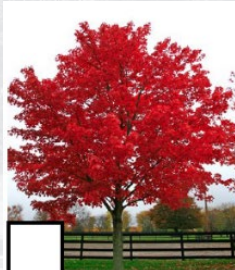

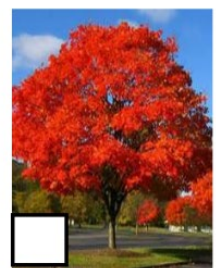

Did You Know?

70.01 MANNER OF PARKING

(A) It shall be unlawful for the operator of any vehicle to stop or park the vehicle in a manner other than with its right-hand side toward and parallel with the curb.

(B) No vehicle shall be parked or left standing on any street unless its two right wheels are within one foot of and parallel with the curb, except that on one-way streets where parking is permitted on the left side, the two left wheels are to be within one foot of and parallel with the curb.

70.05 PARKING IN EXCESS OF CERTAIN NUMBER OF HOURS PROHIBITED - TOWING AUTHORIZED

(A) No vehicle shall remain on the street for a period of 24 consecutive hours. This section shall not apply to a vehicle that has been disabled on the main traveled portion of the roadway for 48 hours or less.

(B) Any vehicle left parked in any one place on any of the public ways or streets of the city for a period of 24 hours or longer shall be deemed abandoned and shall be subject to all existing regulations of the city pertaining to abandoned motor vehicles.

Safe Walking Tips

Walk Facing Traffic

If there is no sidewalk and you must walk in the street, choose the side where you are facing oncoming traffic. In the United States, this is the left side of the road. Walking opposite traffic gives you the best chance to see vehicles approaching close to you.

Be Visible

Give drivers every chance to see you by wearing bright-colored clothing during daylight hours. Be especially careful near dawn and dusk when the sun is low and blinding. Wear a reflective vest while walking at night.

Keep the Volume Down

Don't drown out your environment when listening to music with earbuds or headphones. Keep the volume at a level where you can still hear bike bells, approaching vehicles, and warnings from others. If you are using ear buds, consider wearing only one so that you can hear your surroundings.

Hang Up and Eyes Up

Distracted walking due to chatting, texting, or using a mobile device is as dangerous as doing those things while driving. You are distracted and not as aware of your environment. You are less likely to recognize traffic danger, tripping hazards, or passing joggers and bikers.

Walk Dogs on Short Leashes

It is terrifying and tragic to witness dogs running into traffic or getting into a fight. When walking your dog on a long leash there is also a danger that you will trip other walkers or bikers. You will keep your dog safer as well as those who pass by you if you use proper leash walking etiquette.

Teach your Children to be Aware

While on family strolls, never allow your toddlers to run ahead or fall behind. Teach them to avoid unfamiliar animals. Encourage them to be safe pedestrians and make them aware that vehicles might back out of driveways.
